Pastor's Musings

The word "Advent" never appears in scripture. The word Parousia (Greek for "coming" or "arrival") is not translated as "Advent", but it is the word that is most connected with the word Advent. We could think of this arriving or coming in a few different ways. We could think of it as the coming of the new church year and the soon to be celebrated coming of the birth of Jesus. We could also think of it in another way. In the early church, this word Parousia was also used when talking about the second coming of Christ. In our denomination and in many other mainline denominations, we can sometimes be a little too shy about talking about the second coming, leaving that to the more conservative churches. Instead, we mumble about it and say we don't know, which is true and can be a relief. But not addressing it at all sometimes feels like something is missing from our learning and our worshipping of God.

After all, we are sometimes called a creedal church too, and that means that we follow the creeds of the church

and even proclaim them in worship. Both the Apostles creed and the Nicene creed say essentially the same thing: That Jesus will come back "to judge the living and the dead" and the Nicene creed adds "and his kingdom will have no end". So, we say we believe that, but do we literally? And if we do, what do we think that would look like?

Part of my answer is going to be the cop out I already said...we don't know how or when or even **if**, but we have faith. I like to think of it using Star Trek, the famous set of series and movies. Not that Earth in that universe is perfect, far from it, but it does give us a glimpse, a tiny slice of what the kingdom of God might look like.

See, in the Star Trek universe, there is no hunger anymore because food and drink is free for all, there is no disease anymore, there is no poverty because all have what they need. Most importantly, there is no war, because they finally understood that there are no winners in war and war really doesn't solve anything. There is no war, on Earth, at least, other alien races engaged in war but on Earth that didn't happen. Part of the explanation in the Star Trek lore is that, when alien races first contacted humans, we finally had confirmation that we weren't alone in the universe and humanity put aside their differences and realized the fighting over resources, over borders, was silly and just hurt others unnecessarily. We united and took pride in being human and learned to take care of each other.

The thing is, there is enough housing and food and water and other resources in the world today that no one must be homeless or hungry or thirsty or have any need. We humans just aren't very good at sharing. Now if you think this message, this idea is a political one, a socialist one, you should realize that this is firmly the message of Jesus Christ. Jesus was intensely and totally political, which means of and for the people. But Jesus was not partisan. He wanted **ALL** people to be part of the kingdom of God. All people. He wanted all people to have their needs met and to be the happy and healthy in the kingdom, here on Earth.

So, one way of thinking about Advent, about the second coming of God, is imagine what the world would look like if all people had housing and food and water, if all wars would end, if disease and illness could be eradicated. And Jesus would be there, in some way that we don't understand today. That is the message of Advent, of the promised coming of Christ. It's not the coming of Christmas that is ultimately important. Instead, Advent is the annual reminder that the Kingdom of heaven on earth is a real thing that can, and probably should happen, and we should not only be ready for it, but work to hasten its arrival. If there's one thing I know, it's that if Christ will return in some recognizable, bodily form or in some way we don't understand yet, it won't


