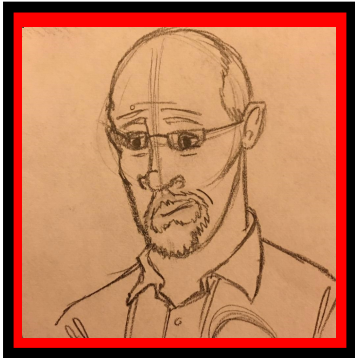

Pastor's Musings

Matthew 19: 13-15

¹³Then little children were being brought to him in order that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples spoke sternly to those who brought them; ¹⁴but Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." ¹⁵And he laid his hands on them and went on his way.

It makes me so happy that one of the biggest ministries of St. Luke, one could argue the biggest and most important, is ministry to children. After all, we have two preschools and an after school program here, we have an active youth group and we have various special activities at various times during the year where families with children come here. Like when we had about 500 people with children for our annual Easter Egg hunt.

I've always tried to treat children of any age the same way as adults. I speak to them with respect, I engage with them and try to honor their

emotions and ideas. I actually had a friend tell me it was weird that I said hello to the kids when I came to hang out with the adults. "None of the other adults do that, but you go ask the kids how they're doing and that's weird. Why do you do that?" It seemed like a strange question. I treat them the way I treat everyone, connecting with them and genuinely wondering how they are doing.

See, the problem is, we often treat kids as less capable than they really are, less capable of understanding complex ideas, less capable of emotional maturity, less capable of problem solving. We naturally discount their opinions and say they are just kids. I have found, in twenty-five years of doing various aspects of children's ministry, that the more you get to know kids, the more you realize all that they are capable of. I am regularly surprised at the kinds of questions and comments that get brought up in children's sermons. I've even had preschool chapel with ACP change course because a three-year-old asked a surprisingly deep question.

In Jesus' time, child mortality was so high that even if you made it past infancy, you had a slim chance to survive to adulthood. People loved their children, but they devalued them even more until they were old enough to work and contribute to the family and get married. So, the idea of anyone listening to a child of six or seven years old, let alone a three-year-old, would have seemed crazy. Only because it might have felt like a waste of time to invest time and energy

and even education in a child who might not survive. But Jesus breaks that mold, honoring and respecting the children and even laying hands on them, and blessing them. This was extremely counter-cultural at the time.

Jesus not only understood that all children of God are special but also that even young children are capable of wisdom, that the Holy Spirit might even speak with the mouth of a three year old.

You've heard that phrase, "out of the mouth of babes" to say that sometimes children say surprisingly wise or insightful things, often without even realizing the depth of their words. That phrase comes from a longer passage from Psalm 8.

Psalm 8:2: *"Out of the mouth of babes and sucklings hast thou ordained strength because of thine enemies, that thou mightiest still the enemy and the avenger"*

In a way, I think that this congregation honors the value of children more than many others through our words and our actions. We know that even young children are capable of big things, and even bigger ideas. I'm so glad that children are so central to our ministry here at St. Luke.

This month, we will be hosting our annual Sports Camp and Vacation Bible School. Please say some extra prayers this month for all of the children who come and spend part of their lives here at St. Luke.

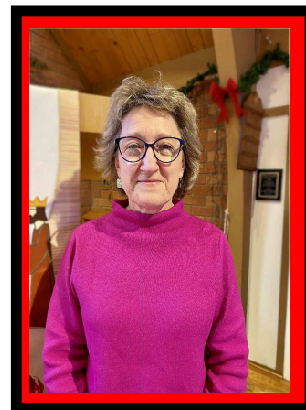

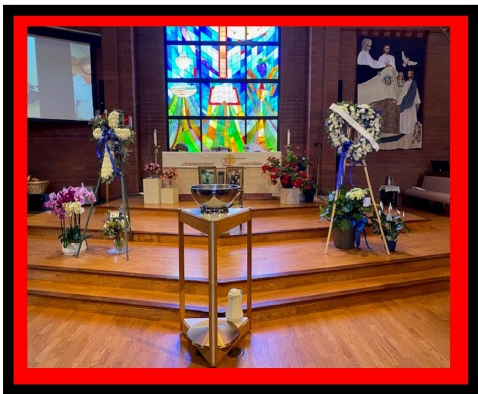
