The Holy Spirit opened up every possible door and wouldn't let me say no anymore. The journey has rarely been easy, but I am so glad I took it, and I am so excited to continue on this journey here at St. Luke.

The thing about these special days, is that while they are one day out of many, they aren't one day events. Every day I praise and thank God for my birth, even if I only celebrate it one day a year. Every day I celebrate being married to my wife, even though only one day is our anniversary. In the same way, I only have one anniversary of my ordination, but I celebrate my call that led to that event every single day. Part of the reason I do that is that we ALL get the honor of celebrating these milestones in community. We share the pride that we have been married another year or that we have gotten a little older, and perhaps wiser.

Take time to celebrate your milestones, your anniversaries, your birthdays. It's worth it, not only for you, but for those in your community who care for you.
